Transitioning from Training to Service



As an NHSC clinician serving the underserved, you will receive timely communications including webinar invitations, informative emails and other helpful resources to assist you in finding an NHSC-approved site for successful service.

What to Do First:

- Think about the cities or states where you might want to work and live when you complete your training. NHSC-approved sites are located across the U.S., so begin to develop your top five list. Begin with the <u>Health Workforce Connector</u> to help narrow your search.
- Find out what it is like to work at an NHSC-approved site by <u>viewing stories from</u> <u>NHSC members in service</u>.
- There are people in communities across the U.S. who can support your site selection. Identify the <u>state primary care office</u> or <u>state primary care association</u> in the areas where you might want to live.

We provide resources and information on these topics:

- Site searches, resume writing, and interviews.
- NHSC-approved site types, Health Professional Shortage Area (HPSA) scores, navigating the <u>Health Workforce Connector</u>, and connecting with mentors and other NHSC partners who can be resources in the field.
- Engaging with family members in your search process.
- Negotiating your employment contract.
- Program guidelines, upcoming virtual job fairs featuring NHSC-approved sites, discussion forums, and much more.
